Pastor's Column

Dear Parishioners,

In our first reading, we hear Joshua's challenge to the Israelites: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15). Joshua is asking them to decide whom they will follow. We see something similar in the Gospel, where Jesus, after teaching about eating his flesh and drinking his blood, turns to the Twelve and asks, "Do you also want to leave?" (John 6:67). This question is just as relevant for us today. Many people find it hard to accept that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist. We're asked to respond as Peter did: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal

life" (John 6:68).

With this commitment in mind, here are my thoughts on the last few practical ways our Archbishop suggested for Eucharist renewal:

The Sign of Peace:

The true meaning of this ritual has been lost. The Sign of Peace is not meant to be a time for casual greetings or loud exchanges. It isn't the "Seventh-inning stretch" of the Mass. Jesus says, "If you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift" (Matthew 5:23-24).

This gesture should be about reconciliation, not social interaction. A simple nod or bow to those immediately to your left and to your right is sufficient. No words need to be exchanged, nor chatting, nor excessive movement.

Proper Reception of the Eucharist:

When the priest presents the host and says, "The Body of Christ," respond clearly with "Amen" before receiving. This "Amen" is our profession of faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Some have developed the habit of waiting until after receiving the host to say "Amen," or omitting it altogether.

Method of Reception:

- If receiving on the tongue: Open your mouth and extend your tongue slightly to allow the priest to place the host on your tongue.
- If receiving in the hand: a. Ensure your hands are clean. b. If right-handed, place your left hand on top of your right. If left-handed, do the opposite. This creates an obvious place for the priest to place the host. c. Allow the priest to place the host on the palm of your hand. Do not reach out with your fingers and take it from the priest. d. Step to the side, and using your lower hand, reverently and immediately consume the host.

Consuming the Host:

It is crucial to consume the host immediately after receiving it, while still in view of the priest. Do not walk away with the host in your hand. The priest has a sacred duty to ensure that the Blessed Sacrament is consumed reverently and not mishandled. By consuming the host where the priest can see you, you assist him in fulfilling this important responsibility.

Moment of Thanksgiving:

After receiving Communion, take a moment for silent prayer and thanksgiving. This is a precious time of intimate union with our Lord.






